GOVERNOR LEON GUERRERO ANNOUNCES REOPENING OF TOURISM ON JULY 1

During a press conference on May 27, Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero issued Executive Order 2020-16 and announced the following developments:

- Additional and updated guidance for dine-in restaurants, places of worship, nonprofit organizations, and group fitness/exercise lessons effective May 29.
- The Government of Guam will reopen on Monday, June 1.
- Gov. Leon Guerrero also

- announced during the press conference the tentative opening of tourism. Guam can begin to receive visitors from Japan, South Korea and Taiwan on July 1, 2020.
- The emergency period was also extended another 30 days through June 30.

THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES RELEASES GUIDANCE MEMO 2020-10

DPHSS announced that the following additional businesses and organizations are allowed to operate during PCOR 2:

- Eating and Drinking Establishments to include dine-in services (with the exception of food courts and bars and taverns)
- Places of Worship at no more than the percent of occupancy rate as identified in current or future Executive Orders and face coverings required to be worn at all times.
- Non-Profit Organization operations limited to similar business activities that are already authorized in this or previous DPHSS Guidance Memoranda; and
- Noncontact Physical Exercise Lessons/Classes to include crossfit, yoga, Pilates, and dance.

ROAD TO RECOVERY PLAN

As Guam prepares to reopen to receive its first visitors beginning on July 1, there are some obstacles that the industry will need to address before we are able to market Guam and truly open:

- 1. Continue to manage the number of confirmed cases on Guam
- 2. Work with source markets to cancellation travel alerts
- 3. Secure airline seat capacity
- 4. Share information about Guam's health and safety protocols in the source markets

On May 29, Guam Visitors Bureau sent a news release to the travel trade and stakeholders in the source markets to announce the opening of our borders for travelers from Japan, South Korea and Taiwan.

The release also announced that the mandatory quarantine measures and testing requirements have been lifted.

GVB is working in collaboration with Guam Customs on logistics for a routine schedule to ensure a smooth transition to the new location.

GVB IMPROVEMENTS



GVB PREPARES FOR REOPENING

GVB has stepped up efforts to prepare for reopening. We have increased our trash removal and landscape maintenance services at the beaches, parks, and along the sidewalks.

The GVB Destination Management committee has completed the Fujita Ponding Basin project, which removed 150 cubic yards (equivalent to 25 full size dump tuck loads) of silt and two dump truck loads of garbage (plastic furniture, tree branches, furniture parts, cans, and bottles). As a result, the water within the basin dropped 2.5 feet.

We are actively cleaning out the culvert, which should be completed before the rainy season.





SOCIAL DISTANCING: IATA



Where IATA stands

IATA recommends mandatory facecoverings for passengers and masks for crew as one of several actions to further reduce risk of contracting COVID-19 on board the aircraft.

IATA does NOT support mandating social distancing measures that would leave middle seats empty.

Even if making the middle seat vacant, the average seat width is less than 50 cm, so it is not possible to keep the distance of 1-2 meters recommended for maintaining a social distance.

Measures to Reduce the already low risk of onboard transmission

- Temperature screening of passengers, airport workers and travelers.
- Boarding and deplaning processes that reduce contact with other passengers or crew.
- Limiting movement within the cabin during flight.
- More frequent and deeper cabin cleaning.
- Simplified catering procedures that lower crew movement and interaction with passengers.




The Economic Impact of Social Distancing

Calls for social distancing measures on aircraft would fundamentally shift the economics of aviation by slashing the maximum load factor to 62%. That is below the average industry breakeven load factor of 77%.

With fewer seats to sell, unit costs would rise sharply.

Compared to 2019, air fares would need to go up dramatically, between 43% and 54% depending on the region.

JAPAN LIFTS STATE OF EMERGENCY NATIONWIDE

- Prime Minister Abe Shinzo has declared the lifting of the emergency in the last five of the country's 47 prefectures. The final five were Tokyo and three surrounding prefectures, as well as the northernmost island of Hokkaido.
- Every three weeks, the government evaluates the infection situation and the risk of spread of infection and gradually reduces restrictions on going out and restrictions on holding events.

JAPAN LIFTS STATE OF EMERGENCY NATIONWIDE

The government evaluates the infection situation and the risk of spread of infection and gradually reduces restrictions on going out and restrictions on holding events.

GOING OUT

- Avoid unnecessary and urgent movement across prefectures within the month of May.
- For the period of June 1 to 18, allowing crossprefecture travel, but refrain from travel to Tokyo, Kanagawa Saitama, Chiba and Hokkaido.
- No restrictions from June 19.

EVENT

- Concert and exhibitions are allowed to be held with limited number.
- Professional sports like baseball, J-league will start from June 19 with no audience.
- From August 1, the event will be held regardless of scale, but the capacity is less than half.

Lifted Nationwide Emergency

DOMESTIC TRAVEL

- Travelling domestically will be gradually restarted from May 25 within prefecture.
- Outside of prefecture from June 19.
- No restriction from August 1.

ENTERTAINMENT BUSINESS

• For the time being, entertainment venues like clubs are still under consideration.

- Tokyo Governor has announced a plan for reopening business after the state of emergency expires.
- Tokyo residents need to follow a new social behavior.



AIRPORT SCREENING FOR DOMESTIC TRAFFIC

- The Civil Aviation Bureau of the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (JCAB) is conducting the body temperature by thermography at 6 airports.
- Entrance of the security checkpoint at each airport.
- Passengers with a body temperature of 37.5 degrees or higher may be handed a leaflet created by MLIT and refuse to board.





SOCIAL DISTANCING MEASURES



All Nippon Airways will make it mandatory for passengers to wear a mask aboard planes and at the airport, starting in June. ANA cabin attendants and ground staff wear masks, gloves and other forms of protective clothing.

- From June 1, ANA staff will be required to wear a mask at all times on planes and at the airport, including at security checkpoints and boarding gates.
- 2. ANA may deny boarding to people not wearing a mask or showing symptoms of illness, including fever. Exceptions will be made for small children and certain cases.
- 3. ANA does not block the middle seats at time of booking.
- 4. All aircraft cabins are equipped with the latest filters to ensure that all air in the cabin is refreshed approximately every 3 minutes.




Japan Airlines' shares new seat allocation in the cabin:

- If there are two seats next to each other, you cannot make reservations for the aisle.
- If there are three seats next to each other, you can't book in the middle.
- If there are four seats next to each other, you will not be able to reserve the middle 2 seats.



KOREA COVID-19 SITUATION




On 22 May 2020, 20 new cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) were reported in South Korea. As of that date, 215 new infections were related to cluster infections that occurred in some clubs at Itaewon, an entertainment district in Seoul. Authorities announced that they would strengthen the restrictions and conduct over 10 thousand tests to clubgoers and their families/immediate contacts.

Schools have been reopened for high school seniors on May 20.

Guam Airport Beefs Up Safety to Prepare for Tourists' Return; The Guam Daily Post; May 26



- As Guam expects to welcome visitors as early as July 1, Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA) is preparing the airport into a virus-free environment.
- Additional thermal screening cameras and sneeze guards, and stationed nurses were added to the airport. Sneeze guards at counters, protection booths and inspection booths are planned to be installed. Plus, \$500,000 was set aside for unidentified needs in the future.

Consumer Sentiment to Rise in 4 Months; Money S News; May 26

CONSUMER

- South Korea's consumer sentiment index (CCSI) came to 77.6 in the month, up 6.8 points from a month earlier when the index dropped to the lowest level since December 2008, according to Bank of Korea.
- Bank of Korea advised that the slowdown of COVID-19 cases in Korea outlooks for the whole economy conditions to improve, causing increasement in CCSI.

EUROPE TO LIFT RESTRICTIONS

Some Europe countries such as Spain, Greece, and Portugal announced plans to lift entry restrictions for tourists (including tourists from South K orea)

In July.

- Spain will reopen to overseas tourists from July. Also Spain's soccer league will restart the season at the beginning of next month.
- The Greek government announced that the country will accept the international tourists from June 15. Hotels will open and international air services will be allowed. Beginning July 1, direct international flights will be operated gradually.
- Portugal's tourism will be reopened from July.

Taiwan reopened professional baseball game to 1000 audience on 8 May and 2000 audience on 16 May. As of 14 May, there has not been a domestically infected case in Taiwan for 32 consecutive days.
