

JAPAN

- Japanese government plans to set the maximum number of domestic spectators at Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic events at 10,000
- State of emergency in Okinawa prefecture is extended until July 11 due to the severe pressure on the medical system; however, will end in Tokyo and other prefectures on June 21
- Japanese government is getting ready to issue vaccine passports for international travel in July
- Mass vaccination centers in Tokyo and Osaka started inoculating people between the ages of 18 and 64 on June 17
- Strengthened border measures remain effective, with only Japanese citizens and residents with valid documents allowed to re-enter Japan
- Japan Airlines and ANA Airlines both began offering vaccination in the workplace
- United Airlines UA196/197 continues its daily flight operation, with other UA flights suspended until Sept 7; UA165/166 suspended until Oct 4; T'Way TW311/312 suspended until Sept 30; Jeju Air 7C3174/3173 suspended until June 30
- Tour cancellation has been extended in response to flight suspensions
- Estimated air seat capacity forecast for CY21 is 146,981 seats

TAIWAN

- Taiwan received a shipment of 2.5 million doses of Moderna vaccine donated by the United States government, obtaining its single largest batch of COVID-19 vaccines in a single day since the pandemic began early last year
- Two of Taiwan's famous landmarks were lit up this past Sunday night with messages of thanks to the United States for donating Moderna COVID-19 vaccines
- People who received their first dose of the AstraZeneca (AZ) COVID-19 vaccine before May 9 can now make appointments for their second shot
- COVID-19 home test kits will become available in stores across Taiwan
- Restrictions of citizens and non-citizens entering Taiwan are shown in appendix

SOUTH KOREA


- South Korea's new cases fell due to fewer tests over the weekend, but rising COVID-19 variant cases, along with pandemic fatigue, are hampering the virus battle
- People who are semi-vaccinated, meaning two weeks have elapsed since taking first dose, do not need to wear masks outdoors; capacity and gathering limits don't apply to the vaccinated people
- Korea met first vaccine target of 13 million adults; government aims to inoculate 36 million by September
- Vaccinating younger population, 18-59 years, beginning July, allowing for mix and match jabs
- Social distancing rules will be relaxed and allow private gatherings of up to six people in the greater Seoul area
- Interpark Tour conducted pre-sale of overseas packages to target FITs; destinations included Guam
- Home & Shopping will open overseas travel package products for the first time since the outbreak of the COVID-19
- Mode Tour has launched exclusive products for Guam and Saipan targeting the Chuseok holiday, operated by Jeju Air's chartered flights
- Total June outbound seat capacity is 945 seats, with Jin Air flying 5 times

PHILIPPINES

- 11.67 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines are expected to be delivered in July
- Incoming international flights are back at Mactan-Cebu International Airport (MCIA); first flights are from Singapore via Scoot and from South Korea via JinAir
- Philippines signed its biggest supply deal for vaccines in 2021, procuring 40 million doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine
- Metro Manila and Bulacan are placed under a looser type of general community quarantine from June 16 to 30

PROPOSED TRANSITION IN TRAVELER QUARANTINE INTO GUAM

Criteria for Consideration of Implementing Changes:

- Achieve >70% of Adult Eligible Population Fully Vaccinated
- 2. Maintain COVID Hospitalizations <10
- Maintain 14-Day COVID Death Sum <5 (Subject to Change at Anytime)

*Fully Immunized defined as 2-weeks after 2nd dose of 2 dose series, or after single dose of single dose series


***Documentations Required for Exemption From Quarantine via COVID-19 Vaccination Include:

- Photo identification, AND
- Primary COVID-19 Vaccination Record, AND
- ***Secondary form of COVID-19 vaccine verification, AND
- Declaration of Individual Attesting to COVID-19 vaccination, signed under penalty of perjury

***Individuals vaccinated in Guam, whose vaccination information are verifiable via WebIZ application, will NOT be required to present a secondary form of vaccine verification.

For everyone else, acceptable secondary form of COVID-19 vaccine verification includes the following:

- Vaccinating health authority record;
 OR
- 2. Vaccinating provider letter; OR,
- 3. Receipt of COVID-19 vaccine administered; OR,
- Other form of secondary verification, to be approved at the reviewing officer's discretion.

GUAM ENTRY PROTOCOLS





Executive Order No. 2021-10

- QUARANTINE FOR INCOMING TRAVELERS. Pursuant to applicable law and the Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) Guidance, all incoming travelers shall be subject to quarantine at a government facility.
 - CDC GUIDELINES FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL. On January 12, 2021, the CDC announced an Order requiring all air passengers arriving in the U.S. from a foreign country to get tested no
 more than three (3) days before their flight departs and to present the negative result or documentation of having recovered from COVID-19 to the airline before boarding the flight. Air
 passengers will also be required to confirm that the information they present is true in the form of an attestation.
 - EXEMPTION FOR VACCINATED TRAVELERS. Effective at 12:01AM on May 15, 2021, all incoming travelers who have been fully vaccinated with an FDA approved COVID-19 vaccine authorized for emergency use (i.e. Pfizer-BioNTech, Modema, or Johnson & Johnson/Janssen), upon verification, are not subject to quarantine at a government facility. Travelers availing of this exemption shall be required to self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms and comply with applicable DPHSS Guidance, including for verification requirements.

Governor Lou Leon Guerrero signed Executive Order No. 2021-13, relative to amending restrictions for incoming travelers and quarantine facilities, and other conditions during Pandemic Condition of Readiness 3 (PCOR 3), and order such that:

- QUARANTINE FOR INCOMING TRAVELERS. Pursuant to applicable law and the Department of Public Health and Social Services Guidance (DPHSS), all incoming travelers shall be subject to quarantine at a government facility.
- EXEMPTION FOR VACCINATED TRAVELERS EXTENDED TO INDIVIDUALS WITH WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO) AUTHORIZED VACCINES. Effective at 12:01AM on June 19, 2021, all incoming travelers who have been fully vaccinated with an FDA or WHO authorized COVID-19 vaccine (including, but not limited to, Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, Johnson & Johnson/Janssen, and AstraZeneca), upon verification, are exempt from quarantine. Travelers availing of this exemption shall be required to self monitor for COVID-19 symptoms and comply with applicable DPHSS Guidance, including for verification requirements.
- UNVACCINATED TRAVELERS. Effective at 12:01AM on June 19, 2021, incoming travelers who, upon 72 hours of arrival in Guam, present a negative PCR or antigen test taken within 72 hours of arrival, are eligible for home quarantine and self-monitoring as provided in applicable to DPHSS Guidance.

SOUTH KOREA ENTRY MEASURES

TRAVELERS TO KOREA

- As of May 5 those vaccinated in South Korea can bypass quarantine
- Secure negative certificate within 72 hours before departure (English or Korean is acceptable) Approved test:
 - PCR LAMP
 - TMA SDA
- Korean nationals that arrive with a negative test will be required to undergo 2week quarantine at a facility and charged KRW 1.68 million per person (est. \$1,500 USD)
- Korean nationals and longterm foreign residents with registered residence in Korea: 14-day self isolation



"Special Entry Procedure"

- Complete a health status questionnaire and special quarantine report in-flight.
- 2. Airport conducts temperature screening. Immigrants submit the health status questionnaire.
- 3. Check the special quarantine report (residence in Korea, contact information, previous travel, etc.) Install a safety protection app for self quarantine, and submit Korean contact information to confirm compliance with regular self-isolation. If a fever is detected, the individual will be placed in a separate waiting room to undergo COVID-19 testing. Upon confirmation, the individual will be transferred to a quarantine hospital or facility.

"Negative COVID-19 PCR test result"

- Passenger full name and date of birth as indicated in their passport
- 2. Test type
- 3. Test date
- 4. Test result
- Issuance date
- 6. Name of testing institution with stamp/seal



"Baggage claim & Transportation"

 Passengers arriving from overseas may use designated modes of transportation, such as airport buses, shuttle buses to Gwangmyeong KTX Station, and special taxis.

TOTAL THREE (3) PCR TESTS REQUIRED:

- 1. PCR test within 72 hours before departure from destination of origin
- 2. PCR test within 24 hours upon arrival into Korea
- 3. PCR test a day before quarantine release

PHILIPPINES ENTRY MEASURES

Filipino nationals

- · Philippine Passport
- Proof of citizenship
- Pre-booked quarantine hotel accredited by Tourism and Health Agencies for at least 10 days
- RT-PCR Test on the 7th day of arrival/quarantine (at traveler's expense, except for OFWs, which shall be shouldered by OWWA/LMAs)
- Must have negative COVID-19 test within 72-hours prior to departure; subject to a RT-PCR test on arrival at their own expense
- Must be pre-booked at an accredited quarantine facility/hotel for at least 10 days at the traveler's expense;

- This does not apply to nationals of the Philippines who are Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) and passengers with a 9(E) visa
- Must present an electronic "Case Investigation Form" upon arrival
- Must undergo RT-PCR testing on day 7 after arrival and quarantine for 14 days
- Passengers must install the contact tracing app 'TRAZE' on their personal device before departure

II. NOT ALLOWED TO TRAVEL TO THE PHILIPPINES

The travel restriction imposed by IATF Resolution No. 112, s. 2021 for **ALL travelers** coming from India or those with travel history in India within the last fourteen (14) days preceding arrival in the Philippines shall remain in force.

All of the foregoing is without prejudice to the exercise of the mandate of the Bureau of Immigration in Arrival and Departure Formalities.



REVISED GUIDELINES AS PER IATF-MEID RESOLUTION NO. 113 SERIES OF 202

In view of the foregoing, the following guidelines shall govern the entry of passengers to the Philippines **beginning 01 May 2021**:

I. ALLOWED TO TRAVEL TO THE PHILIPPINES

- Filipino citizens, including those with Identification Certificate (IC) as proof of recognition as a Filipino citizen or as proof of retention/reacquisition of Philippine citizenship under RA9225;
- 2. Foreign nationals with valid and existing visas at the time of entry;
- Foreign nationals allowed entry under the Balikbayan Program (RA6768), provided they are nationals from non-visa required countries under EO408:
 - Former Filipino citizens, together with their foreign spouses and children, regardless of age, who are travelling with them; and
 - b. Filipino citizens' spouses and children, regardless of age, who are travelling with them.
- 4. Foreign nationals who are holders of valid and existing Special Resident and Retirees Visa (SRRV) or Section 9(a) visas, provided they present, upon arrival, an entry exemption document issued by the Department of Foreign Affairs.

Except for Section 9(e) visa holders who are covered by a different testing and quarantine protocols, the entry of all other foreign nationals shall be subject to the following conditions:

- a. With pre-booked accommodation for at least seven (7) nights in an accredited quarantine hotel/facility; and
- Subject to COVID-19 testing at the quarantine hotel/ facility on the sixth (6th) day from date of arrival.

The pre-booked accommodation for at least seven (7) nights in a quarantine hotel accredited by the Department of Tourism (DOT) shall be presented for initial check at the immigration counters. Those who fail to present a pre-booked accommodation shall be denied entry and shall be boarded immediately in the next available flight.

Foreign nationals who were cleared for entry but subsequently found to have presented a counterfeit or fraudulent pre-booked accommodation upon validation by the DOT, or those who will violate the testing and quarantine protocols of the Department of Health, shall be subject to deportation.

JAPAN MARKET SUMMARY



HIGHLIGHTS

- The Japanese government is planning to set the maximum number of domestic spectators at Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic events at 10,000.
- The government has decided to extend the state of emergency in Okinawa Prefecture until July 11 due to the severe pressure on the medical system.
- The Japanese government plans to end the COVID-19 state of emergency covering Tokyo and eight other prefectures on June 21.
- The Japanese government is getting ready to issue vaccine passports to resume international travel this July.
- Total number of vaccinations in Japan so far has exceeded 28 million doses (as of June 17).





 More than 40.5% of the senior citizens have received one dose of the vaccine, and more than 20% have been fully vaccinated for the second time (as of June 17).





- All local governments in Japan are expected to complete vaccination of senior citizens (+65) by the end of July (36 million senior people in total)
- Workplace vaccinations began on June 21, and at least about 2 million people will be vaccinated.
- The EU 27 countries have judged that the infection of the new coronavirus in Japan is under control to some extent and have decided to accept Japanese tourists ahead of the summer tourist season, hoping to increase the number of Japanese tourists.
- Outbound travel from other countries except Japan has already begun from European countries, and is expected to recover gradually from the summer of 2021, reaching nearly the 2019 level by the end of 2022.
- With the acceleration of vaccination programs in Japan, the expected ranking of the demand recovery by destination for overseas travel is Hawaii, Guam, mainland U.S., Europe, Australia, and Asia. (HIS President)


- · The government has lifted the emergency declarations that had been issued for 10 prefectures except Okinawa.

- The seven prefectures that shifted to the pre-emergency stage from the state of emergency were Hokkaido, Tokyo, Aichi, Kyoto, Osaka, Hyogo and Fukuoka.
- The restriction is set to continue through July 11.
- Restaurants and bars serving food and beverages must continue to close by 8PM.
- Permission to serve the alcoholic beverages until 7:00 p.m. on condition that infection control measures are taken, it may change by the governor's discretion.
- Strive to reduce the number of employees coming to the office by utilizing telework.
- The maximum capacity for a large event will be the lesser of "5,000 people" or "50% of the venue's capacity.

VACCINATION PASSPORT

- Japanese government plans to issue vaccine passports to resume international travel this July.
- Modelling its system on the EU's Covid Certificate system. (Digital Green Certificate)
- EU models are enable to exempts the vaccine passport holder from testing and quarantine measures.
- Allowing business travelers to travel abroad
- Foreign residents to visit their home countries. Issuance of certificates on paper first.
- A digital platform will be ready within this year.
- The certificates will be issued by municipalities.
- · The system will be linked to the national vaccination record system, and paper certificates with QR codes will be issued.
- In the future, the QR code will be used as an electronic certificate in smartphone application.

VACCINATION AT WORKPLACE (JAL&ANA)

JAL INITIATIVES

- Japan Airlines has started workplace vaccination on June 14.
- About 36,000 group employees are targeted, with priority given to crew members involved in international flight operations and those engaged in ground operations.
- Two doses of vaccination are expected to be completed in mid-July.
- After June 21, the number of people to be vaccinated is expected to be 330 people per day on average.
- The vaccinations will be administered by company's in-house industrial physicians and nurses a health inspection contractor.



ANA INITIATIVES

- ANA started vaccination in the workplace on June 13.
- The first round of vaccinations is expected to be completed by the end of July for international flight crew and cabin crew.
- About 10,000 flight attendants will be vaccinated, which is about 20% of the total number of Group employees eligible for vaccination.
- The vaccination program will be extended to other group employees in order.
- The expansion of the scope of vaccination including employees' families and contractors will be considered.








- People who are semi-vaccinated, meaning two weeks have elapsed since taking just one of the two prescribed doses, no longer need to wear masks outdoors. The capacity and gathering limits don't apply to the vaccinated people either.
- Once two weeks have past since the second dose, people are considered fully vaccinated, after which point even wider-ranging waivers from social distancing are granted. On top of being exempt from post-travel quarantine, they may also be able to take their masks off in places like movie theaters where maintaining a safe distance from another person is difficult.

- South Korea plans to vaccinate healthy adults aged 19 to 49 starting in the third guarter of 2021.
- Under the current plan, senior citizens in group homes and people working in highrisk medical or nursing facilities will be vaccinated first.
- The plan is still under review and the priority order may change depending on the situation.



KOREA MEETS FIRST VACCINE TARGET: 13 MILLION PEOPLE GET ONE DOSE

- Korea reached its COVID-19 vaccine target for the first half of the year with 13 million adults inoculated with at least one dose since its vaccination campaign kicked off on Feb. 26.

SOUTH KOREA TO BEGIN INOCULATING YOUNGER POPULATION IN JULY, ALLOW 'MIX AND MATCH' JABS

- South Korea plans to administer COVID-19 vaccines to 22 million people of the general public aged between 18 and 59 starting July as part of its inoculation campaign.
- People aged between 18 and 49 will begin receiving shots in mid-August, high school students taking the college entrance exam and teachers under 30 at nursery schools, primary, middle and high schools getting the first shots.



SOUTH KOREA TO LOOSEN SOCIAL DISTANCING RULES ON JULY 1



- South Korea will relax social distancing rules and allow private gatherings of up to six people in the greater Seoul area from the current four starting July 1.
- Under the revised rules, restaurants, night-life venues and cafes will be allowed to open for business until 12 a.m., versus 10 p.m. currently.
- Unless daily infections spike significantly, the government plans to allow gatherings of up to eight people in the greater Seoul area from July 15.

U.S. DONATION OF 2.5 MILLION MODERNA DOSES ARRIVES IN TAIWAN

Taiwan on Sunday received a shipment of 2.5 million doses of Moderna vaccine donated by the United States government, obtaining its single largest batch of COVID-19 vaccines in a single day since the pandemic began early last year.



The shipment arrived at Taoyuan International Airport around 4:30 p.m. on a China Airlines cargo flight that had left the Memphis early Saturday, U.S. time.

Shortly after the flight landed, the vaccines were transported to a cold chain logistics center, where they will be inspected by health authorities before being cleared for distribution in Taiwan, according to the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC).

The donation of 2.5 million Moderna doses comprises 750,000 pledged by the U.S. on June 6 and 1.75 million it added this weekend.



TAIPEI 101, GRAND HOTEL FLASH THANK-YOU MESSAGES TO U.S.

Two of Taiwan's famous landmarks, the iconic Taipei 101 skyscraper and the palatial Grand Hotel Taipei, were lit up Sunday night with messages of thanks to the United States for donating 2.5 million doses of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to Taiwan.

As night fell, the Taipei 101 tower flashed LED messages such as "Taiwan, U.S. in a joint battle against the pandemic," "Together let's protect Taiwan," "We cherish the Taiwan-U.S. friendship," "Taiwan U.S.," "U.S.A.," and "THANK YOU." The displays, in Chinese and English, were expected to continue until 10 p.m. Sunday, according to the Taipei 101 management.

TAIWAN TO START GIVING SECOND ASTRAZENECA COVID-19 JABS SOON

- People who received their first dose of the AstraZeneca (AZ) COVID-19 vaccine before May 9 can now make appointments for their second shot, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) said Saturday.
- At a press briefing, Health Minister Chen Shih-chung said the second dose is important, because it will help boost immunity, thus giving better protection against COVID-19.
- The second AZ vaccine shots will be administered from June 23, offering the opportunity for full vaccination of the roughly 67,000 people who got their first jab between April 12 and May 9, Chen said.
- As of Friday, some 27,000 people in Taiwan had received their two doses of the AZ vaccine, he said.

COVID HOME TEST KITS TO GO ON SALE IN TAIWAN NEXT WEEK: FDA

- COVID-19 home test kits will become available in stores across Taiwan next week, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) said Saturday.
- The home test kits will not be available online but instead will be sold at physical stores such as pharmacies and licensed medical equipment suppliers, said Chien Chia-hung, deputy head of the FDA's Medical Devices and Cosmetics Division.
- He said the nucleic acid home test kits are likely to cost over NT\$1,000 (US\$35.97), while the rapid antigen self test kits will be much cheaper.

- Note: 1. Travelers are required to make an affidavit stating that the location of their intended 14-day home quarantine in Taiwan (to be conducted in a quarantine hotel or in a home with one person per residence) meets relevant regulations.
 - 2. Travelers who have traveled to the United Kingdom, the Republic of South Africa, the Kingdom of Eswatini, the Federative Republic of Brazil in the past 14 days (transited in those countries included) would be required to stay at group quarantine facilities after arrival in Taiwan and to receive COVID-19 testing.
 - 3. Personnel on diplomatic/official business, migrant workers, <u>students</u>, <u>international patients(including companions)</u> should follow instructions by Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Labor, Ministry of Education, and Ministry of Health and Welfare.
 - 4. Business travelers who meet requirements announced by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) may apply for shorten their required quarantine period—See Regulations concerning short-term business travelers' applications for shortened quarantine periods in Taiwan on CDC website for details.

Travelers should use their mobile phone to log in the Quarantine System for Entry and to fill out the health declaration form prior to their departure. (https://hdhq.mohw.gov.tw/) Show confirmation message to quarantine staff. The confirmation message is required for entering Taiwan.









- Starting May 4, Taiwan to impose entry ban on travelers with history of travel to India, except for R.O.C. nationals and non-R.O.C. nationals with ARC; returning R.O.C. nationals and non-R.O.C. nationals with ARC must be quarantined at group quarantine facilities and undergo testing
- The latest list of the risk categories for countries/regions is as follows:
 - Low-risk countries/regions: New Zealand, Macao, Palau, Brunei, Nauru, the Marshall Islands, Australia, Hong Kong
 - Medium-risk countries/regions: Fiji, Bhutan, Singapore, Israel




11.67 MILLION DOSES OF COVID-19 WACCINES EXPECTED TO ARRIVE IN JULY

A total of 11.67 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines are expected to be delivered in July, Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr., the national vaccine manager, said during the taped weekly briefing with President Rodrigo Duterte.

The deliveries will consist of 4.5 million doses of Sinovac, one million of Moderna, one million of Sputnik V, and 1.17 million of AstraZeneca.



Aside from this, another four million doses of Pfizer and AstraZeneca vaccines are expected to be delivered through the COVAX facility. Meanwhile, 6.4 million doses of Sinovac vaccines expected to arrive this month — 1.5 million doses on June 17 and one million doses on June 25. Further, 250,000 doses of Moderna vaccines will arrive on June 25 and 2.028 million doses of AstraZeneca vaccines, through the COVAX facility, will arrive by the third week of June Galvez said. Also arriving this month are 150,000 doses of Sputnik V vaccines, as well as vaccine donations from the United States. According to Galvez, the Philippines received 8.329 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines from February to May and another 4.376 million in June.

INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS BACK AT MCIA

Incoming international flights are back at Mactan-Cebu International Airport (MCIA). First flights are from Singapore via Scoot and from South Korea via JinAir.

Cebu has its own swabbing policies for incoming Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs) and Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) called the Swab-Upon-Arrival policy. The rule has deviated from those implemented by the IATF that requires incoming Filipino travelers from abroad to undergo quarantine for 14 days in which 10 days will be in an accredited facility and the remaining days in home quarantine. They, too, will only be subjected for swabbing on the seventh day.

In Cebu, ROFs and OFWs will be swabbed upon arrival and will only need to stay in quarantine for a maximum of three days if they test negative for the infection.

Residents in Cebu will also undergo another round of swab tests once they arrive at their respective localities, expenses of which will be shouldered by the Department of Health in Central Visayas (DOH-7).



METRO MANILA PLACED UNDER GCQ 'WITH SOME RESTRICTIONS' UNTIL JUNE 30

Metro Manila and Bulacan are placed under a looser type of general community quarantine from June 16 to 30. Metro Manila and Bulacan have been placed under general community quarantine (GCQ) "with some restrictions" until the end of June, while the rest will be under GCQ "with heightened restrictions."

This is the first time that "NCR Plus" areas are placed under different quarantine classifications.

BIGGEST DEAL: PHILIPPINES SECURES 40 MILLION PFIZER DOSES

The Philippines signed its biggest supply deal for vaccines in 2021, procuring 40 million doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine, vaccine czar Carlito Galvez Jr announced.

"Secretary Duque and I signed yesterday the supply agreement for the biggest and most decisive deal we had for 2021," Galvez said in a statement. Galvez said the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines are expected to arrive in the Philippines "after eight weeks starting August."

This latest deal raises the total secured vaccines up for delivery to 113 million, which also comprises 26 million Sinovac doses, 20 million Moderna doses, 17 million Astrazeneca doses, and 10 million Sputnik doses. Galvez also said the Philippines is set to gain 40 million doses from the COVAX global vaccine-sharing pact.

Pfizer-made vaccines are one of the most preferred by Filipinos, according to an April to May 2021 survey by Social Weather Stations.

TRAVEL ENTRY TO THE PHILIPPINES

ELIGIBLE TRAVELERS TO THE PHILIPPINES

At present, the categories of travelers allowed entry are as follows:

- Filipino nationals
- Non-Filipino/Foreign spouse and minor children or children with special needs of a Filipino national
- Non-Filipino/Foreign parent of a minor Filipino child (18 years old and below) or a child with special needs (regardless of age)
- Former Filipinos (Balikbayan Program), Dual Citizens
- Spouse/Children of Former Filipino Nationals (Balikbayan Program)
- Accredited foreign government and international organization officials and their dependents
- Non-Filipino/Foreign seafarers with 9(c) visa
- Non-Filipino/Foreign nationals in possession of valid certificates
- Non-Filipino/Foreign nationals with an eligible visa





TESTING AND QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS

Eligible arrivals to the Philippines must take a COVID-19 RT-PCR test upon arrival followed by a 14-day quarantine. Arrivals will be tested on the seventh (7th) day of their 14-day quarantine stay, 10 of which shall be observed at an accredited quarantine hotel/facility, and the remaining days for home quarantine under the supervision of the Local Government Unit of their residence. Day one (1) starts on the day of the passenger's arrival.

Please note that children and infants are not exempt from the quarantine and testing requirements. For minimized discomfort, infants will be swabbed through the mouth.

Travelers are subject to the maximum number of allowed inbound passengers at the port and date of entry.

ALLOWANCES FOR VACCINATED ARRIVALS

- Fully vaccinated arrivals to the Philippines are now exempted from the RT-PCR test requirements and will only undergo a 7-day quarantine at an accredited quarantine hotel or facility. To be considered fully vaccinated, at least 14 days have elapsed following the administering of the second dose or at least 14 days after having received a single-dose vaccine.
- Please note that this is only applicable for travelers who have been fully vaccinated in the Philippines by accredited local vaccine administrators and Local Government Units.
- Filipino Nationals and non-Filipinos who received their vaccination outside the Philippines are NOT eligible for the exemption and reduced mandatory quarantine.
