GUAM RECEIVES FIRST SHIPMENT OF COVID-19 VACCINES

Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) Director Arthur San Agustin announced the arrival in Guam of the first 3,900 doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine. The doses were sent as part of the initial nationwide shipments that followed the Emergency Use Authorization for the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine issued by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on December 12.

The department plans to begin vaccinations on Thursday, December 17 at Okkodo High School in Dededo, where the school cafeteria and gymnasium will be set up as a temporary vaccination clinic. The initial doses will be administered through closed points of dispensing (PODs).

DPHSS has partnered with the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) and the Guam Regional Medical City (GRMC) to administer the first doses of the vaccines to those identified under the Phase 1 priority group. DPHSS will distribute vaccines to both GMHA and GRMC, which will administer doses to their respective staff who have been pre-identified to receive the first doses.

The initial doses are dedicated for use as the first of the required two-dose regimen. The manufacturer has reserved an equal number of the second dose, which will be shipped in the coming weeks.

The vaccination plan developed by DPHSS largely follows recommendations by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and prioritizes healthcare workers who are at high risk of contracting COVID-19, such as nurses, physicians, first responders, and residents of long-term care facilities. Prioritizing beyond these groups will be defined by the Guam Vaccine and Antiviral Prioritization Policy Committee (VAPPC).

COVID-19 vaccine implementation will include an initial limited-supply phase followed by a general implementation phase, when large supplies of the vaccine become available.

The FDA stated that the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine was 95% effective in preventing COVID-19 disease. The vaccine is administered as a series of two doses, 21 days apart.

Recommended guidelines from the CDC and ACIP will be used to train DPHSS nurses, vaccinators, and staff in preparation for the administration of the first doses of the vaccine on Guam.

DPHSS PHASE 1A VACCINATION CONTINUES THROUGH SATURDAY; PHASE 1A GROUP ENCOURAGED TO PARTICIPATE

The Department of Public Health and Social Services (DPHSS) will continue Phase 1a vaccinations on Friday, December 18 and Saturday, December 19 at Okkodo High School in Dededo, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.. The school cafeteria and gymnasium are set up as a temporary vaccination clinic. The initial doses will be administered through closed points of dispensing (PODs). The following healthcare personnel not affiliated with the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA) or Guam Regional Medical City (GRMC) defined under the Phase 1a category are encouraged to participate in the temporary vaccination clinic:

1a	Healthcare personnel any person who provides health care services. This can include, but is not limited to, physicians, pharmacists, dentists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, registered and other nurses, paramedics, emergency medical or laboratory technicians, and ambulance and emergency medical workers. If you are eligible to receive the vaccine under Phase 1a, you may proceed to the temporary vaccination clinic. Pre-registration is not required. A government-issued ID is required and you may be asked to present your employment ID.

GDOL TO RELEASE \$11.6 MILLION IN PUA

Per Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero's and Lt. Gov. Joshua Tenorio's directive, the Guam Department of Labor today successfully batched \$11.6 million in Pandemic Unemployment Assistance and Lost Wages Assistance, expected to get into the hands of the people by Christmas for cleared PUA claims through Dec. 9.

"It was the governor's and the department's top priority to get out these unemployment funds by Christmas. My team took on the immense project of clearing more than two months worth of unemployment claims and we're proud to say it was a success," said Department of Labor Director David Dell'Isola.

GDOL has requested the drawdown and funds should hit accounts early next week.

The successful counter measures put in place to prevent fraud and the smooth running of this batch has provided enough confidence for GDOL to try and run another LWA payment for the holidays. We aim to batch Tuesday, Dec. 22 for all cleared LWA claims through Dec. 9.

Guam Department of Labor also continues to put extra effort into problem claims. We encourage those applicants who have not received their initial PUA payment amount to email pua.hotline@dol.guam.gov with the subject line reading — "Urgent: Initial Claim Payment Request." Include your full name and claim number. For all others with open issues, please call 311 for assistance.

For claimants unable to file a weekly claim, please check your hireguam.com application dashboard prior to calling the PUA hotline. Check to see if you have maximized your benefits and reached your 39th week. PUA is a 39-week unemployment program. Please also be aware of the extra security measure of the CAPTCHA code that must be filled in along with your login information on the signin page.

- The number of newly cases nationwide has exceeded 3.000 since December 12.
- A panel of experts agreed that the Japanese government should suspend Go To Travel tourism promotion program for areas where novel coronavirus infections are spreading widely.
- The panel of experts are calling on the government to stop traveling to areas where cases are rising and advise the government should ask residents to refrain from non-essential outings.
- Japan is still mid of the third wave of infection and the medical experts are also urging the government to think of new measures that can be implemented.








- The store-visit type "New Corona PC Inspection Center Shimbashi" opens in front of JR Shinjuku Station from December 4, 2020.
- The center uses the new coronavirus detection kit developed by Toyobo Co., Ltd.






- The number of daily new cases remained around 400 to 600 earlier in recent two weeks, but exceeded over 900 on December 12, and broke through 1,000 on the next day, raising alarm among authorities.
- Cluster infections from private gatherings coupled with massive infections at a church and a hospital in the metropolitan area raised up the tally.
- The current situation is called "the worst crisis" since South Korea saw its first COVID-19 outbreak.

- On December 6, the government decided to raise social distancing measure for the greater Seoul area to level 2.5, and all other area to level 2 amid the third wave of the pandemic.
- However, the government considers enforcing the toughest level of social distancing measure because the coronavirus cases continue to raise and broke the 1,000-mark for the first time on December 13.

GOVERNMENT TO OFFER FREE VIRUS TESTS AMID SPIKE IN COVID-19 CASES

As the virus continues to spike up across the country, the Korean government face growing pressure to take more strict containment steps such as raising the social distancing restriction level.

The government will begin implementing free virus tests at 150 COVID-19 testing sites in Seoul and its surrounding areas from December 14 to January 3, 2021 as the daily virus case reached over 1,000.

The authorities plan to mobilize 810 people, including military and police personnel, to support the aggressive testing campaign.





For the convenience of test takers, the authorities plan to take a quick antigen test and a saliva-based test.

- However, Hong Kong and Singapore have decided to postpone Travel Bubble until next year as the number of local cases of unknown sources increasing rapidly in Hong Kong.





NORTHERN MARIANAS TO OPEN BORDER TO KOREAN TRAVELERS ON JAN 8

- Northern Marianas is to open border to Korean travelers on January 8 with a charter flight. Under the arrangement, tourists must show proof of a negative Covid-19 test 72 hours before arriving in the Northern Marianas.
- The islands' tourism body, the Marianas Visitors Authority, said the this is a litmus on the viability of opening the CNMI to tourism under the new normal.
- If successful, it could pave the way for implementing with Japan.

PROTOCOL

SINGAPORE TO OPEN BORDERS TO TAIWAN

Singapore will lift travel restrictions on visitors from Taiwan starting next Friday (Dec. 18), exempting them from a two-week quarantine provided they test negative for the coronavirus.



Visitors arriving from Taiwan should remain in the island country for at least two weeks and must apply for an air travel pass before flying to Singapore. They will be asked to conduct a PCR test upon arrival, and if they test negative, they will be exempt from home quarantine.
