STAY-AT-HOME ORDER EXTENDED THROUGH SEPT. 11

Governor Lou Leon Guerrero signed Executive Order No. 2020-30, relative to extending the Stay-at-Home order.

Under Executive Order 2020-30, Guam continues to be in Pandemic Condition of Readiness (PCOR) 1, during which the most restrictive conditions are imposed in an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

The Stay-at-Home Order first issued in Executive Order No. 2020-28 and extended in Executive Order No. 2020-29, shall be extended and will continue until 12:00 PM on September 11, 2020, unless extended by further order. All persons in Guam are directed to continue to stay at home, subject to limited exceptions such as obtaining food and household necessities, going to and from work at authorized businesses as identified in applicable DPHSS Guidance, seeking medical care, caring for dependents or pets, caring for a vulnerable person in another location, or for individual exercise. Stay-At-Home conditions instituted in Executive Order No. 2020-29 and in applicable DPHSS Guidance shall remain in effect.

As articulated in Executive Order No. 2020-29, the public health emergency continues until September 30, 2020.

All prior Executive Orders remain in full force and effect except to the extent they conflict with this Order.

UNITED AIRLINES GUAM MARATHON VIRTUAL EVENT EXTENDED FROM SEPT. 5-20

Guam Sports Events, Inc., United Airlines, and the 2020 United Airlines Guam Marathon (UGM) partners announced today that they will be extending the deadline to complete the #UGM2020 Goes Virtual races from Sept. 5 through Sept. 20. The new race dates will give residents and international runners more flexibility to schedule their races within the two weeks to ensure a safer experience for all.

The now two-week-long virtual event, rebranded as #UGM2020 Goes Virtual, will begin on Sept. 5, and runners will need to complete their 5K, 10K, half marathon (13.1 miles) and marathon (26.2 miles) race distances and submit their timing online by Sept. 20. All current #UGM2020 registrants were automatically entered to run the virtual race. They were also automatically deferred to 2021 at no additional cost.

Ben Ferguson, Event Director, Guam Sports Events, Inc. said, "This year is a very different year for UGM. We thank United Airlines, Guam Visitors Bureau, and Pacific Island Club and all our sponsors for having the vision and commitment to support this virtual race. There is still some uncertainty as to when the PCOR 1 restrictions will be lifted in Guam, and we ask all runners to follow their local government mandates and stay safe while having fun."

PACKET PICKUP

The #UGM2020 packet pickup dates have been changed due to the current government restrictions. Once the restrictions are lifted in Guam, registered runners will be able to pick up their race packets

through Sept. 20. Packet pickup details will be relayed at a later date. The packet will include a finisher medal, event t-shirt, beach mat, towel, and event bag.



- Korea reported 299 more novel coronavirus cases on August 30.
- Among new cases, 283 were locally transmitted and 16 imported.
- A large majority of the newly confirmed local cases were found in the Seoul area, 203.
- As the numbers jump back to first-wave levels in recent weeks, with Seoul at the center this time, **Seoul will go into a partial lockdown** for a week in an attempt to stop the novel coronavirus from spreading from the capital to the rest of the country.

SEOUL 'SHUTS DOWN' IN BID TO BLUNT COVID-19

As cluster infections are tied to enclosed areas such as coffeehouses, restaurants and indoor fitness centers, the government has decided to **extend the current Level 2 social distancing for one more week until Sept 6** in Seoul and the surrounding area.

Adding stricter rules imposed for eight days that started August 30, social distancing rule viewed as **"Level 2.5"** on the three-tier system.

Under the rule, restaurants and bakeries can operate until 9 p.m., and only takeaway and delivery will be permitted from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

The government also banned the operation of indoor sports facilities such as fitness centers and driving ranges as well as private academic institutions, including large academies.

JUNIOR DOCTORS DECIDE TO CONTINUE STRIKING

Doctors are opposed to the government's plan to increase admission quotas at medical schools. They argue problems in the current medical service delivery system should be addressed, rather than just adding more doctors.

The Ministry of Health and Welfare announced the doctors who fail to follow the orders could have their licenses revoked and even face jail time of up to three years or a fine of 30 million won (\$30,000) or less.





Trainee doctors across all levels have begun an indefinite strike, protesting the government's medical workforce reform plan.

As part of the country's medical workforce reform plan, the health ministry is planning to expand admission quotas at medical schools by 4,000 over the next 10 years, and to open a new public medical school.

LOW COST CARRIER



- Hyundai Development Corporation stopped the procedure of acquisition after the outbreak of COVID-19, claiming that the pandemic substantially and unexpectedly deteriorated the airline's financial conditions.
- Korea Development Bank Chairman Lee Dong-gull and HDC Hyundai Development Company chairman Chung Mong-gyu met with each other on August 26 to resume the sale of Asiana Airlines.
- LCCs are also considering to focus on cargo to maintain operation amid COVID-19. Jin Air has B777-200ER aircraft but other LCCs are not able to expect much profits from cargo services. T'way and Jeju Air is under discussion with the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport to turn passenger seats to cargo.
- Jin Air scheduled to operate ICN-GUM flight once a week from September but canceled two flights due to new quarantine requirement for travelers entering Guam effective August. Therefore, Jin Air will service flights on September 9, 23, and 30.

TRAVEL INDUSTRY



- The number of domestic passengers in August increased 112% compared to April despite of COVID-19 spread.
- The domestic passengers keep increasing from March. According to the Airportal site, the number of domestic passengers from August 13 to August 27 for two weeks were 2,569,068pax which is a doubled number compared to March, 2020.
- According to the airline, there's no much cancelation on domestic flight and the number of domestic passengers increased compared to July and August last year.
- In time for the Korean Thanksgiving Day in September, the load factors of Jeju routes are almost 50~60% full from end of September to early October.

TAIWAN TO REPLACE THROAT SWABS WITH NEW SALIVA TEST FOR CORONAVIRUS

Taiwan's Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) announced on Sunday (Aug. 30) that a new and less unpleasant way to test for coronavirus will replace the traditional throat swabs at the country's airports beginning Tuesday (Sept 1).



Medical workers need to push a pencil-length swab to the very back of recipients' nasal passages to test for the novel coronavirus, which many find uncomfortable.

SCOOT TO RESUME TAOYUAN-TOKYO FLIGHTS IN SEPTEMBER

Budget airline Scoot announced on Friday it will resume flights between Taiwan's Taoyuan and Japan's Tokyo Narita airports starting Sept 9 as it gradually resumes its schedule of services after disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.





TAIWAN EXTENDS BAN ON TOUR GROUPS INDEFINITELY

The Tourism Bureau has decided to extend the ban on inbound and outbound tour groups indefinitely, reports said Wednesday (Aug 26).

The authority was basing its decision on advice from the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) and on its analysis of the international situation. PALAU TO OPEN TOURISM EXCLUSIVELY TO TAIWANESE TRAVELERS IN SEPTEMBER



Palau is planning to open up for tourism next month starting with Taiwan, Palauan Ambassador to Taiwan Dilmei Louisa Olkeriil told Taiwan News on Tuesday (Aug 25).

Currently, there are two chartered China Airlines flights per month that carry only essential workers, personal, and medical patients between Taiwan and Palau.

Ambassador Olkeriil stated that she has been in touch with Palau tourism authorities and Taiwanese travel agencies to discuss the possibility, hoping to revive Palau's tourism industry.

She also said that both China Airlines and EVA Air have been making preparations to resume the 3.5 hour flights between the two countries.
