I. CALL TO ORDER

II. ROLL CALL

A quorum being present, the meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm by Chairman Ada.

III. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

EXHIBIT A

Director Camacho made a motion, seconded by Director Gatewood, to approve the minutes of the previous Board of Directors meeting dated December 10, 2020, subject to minor corrections. Motion Approved.

IV. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

- Commended the bureau for organizing the memorial for former GVB Japan Manager Yuji Mitsumori held on December 30, 2020.
- Encouraged the board to fight for tourism's startup
- significant progress was made in sustaining a low CAR score; testing and vaccinations have been ramped up
- GVB continues to focus on preparations to make Guam a safe destination to visit
- Thanked oversight chairwoman Senator Therese Terlaje for her support to the bureau and wished her well as the new Speaker of the Guam Legislature
- He thanked outgoing Speaker Senator Tina Muna-Barnes for all her support to the bureau and the industry throughout the years.
- Welcomed the new tourism oversight Chairwoman, Amanda Shelton.
- Thanked TECO (Taipei Economic and Cultural Office) for their continuing efforts to strengthen ties between Guam and Taiwan. They currently support and arrange medical referrals for Guam residents to receive medical treatment in Taiwan.
- A proposition to expand Guam's Taiwan office representation to include GEDA and GIAA is in discussion; Vice President Perez will provide an update
- Thanked Director Gatewood for leading the Membership meeting on December 29, 2020
- Thanked the GVB Board of Directors for their time, service, and support of the bureau in 2020
- Thanked the Management and staff for the work and dedication in 2020 and reminded everyone that the Board should remain committed to working with Management & Staff and the industry to find solutions in the pandemic environment.
- Governor Leon Guerrero relaxed restrictions by moving Guam's PCOR status from PCOR1 to PCOR2
- Encouraged everyone to continue to follow business, wear their masks, practice social distancing, and be consistent with proper hygiene practices.

V. PRESIDENT & CEO and VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

HOT Bond Refinancing

- GVB initiative anticipating austere budgets from COVID-19, needed during slow recovery, approved by the Legislature December 20, 2020
- Conference call with bond counsel and underwriters on January 12, 2021
- GEDA, DOA, BBMR, GVB, AG were all represented
- Discussed tasking schedule for an April 1st delivery date, expected total savings \$14.6 M
- Estimated cashflow benefit to GVB about \$100k this year, \$2.8 M next year, and about \$3.9 M after that for three years
- Zoom calls, rating agencies (S&P Moody's) 2/13, followed by investor presentations 3/5, due diligence and pricing 3/24
- Closing 3/31 and delivery 4/1

Strategic Factors Impacting Recovery

1) Market Environment

- Guam tourism and hospitality industry model built on large scale, east Asian, volume-driven, niche aggregations
- Space distancing scaled-down densities, Post COVID-19 environment is antithesis of touchy-feely and close personal contacts that characterize friendly island destination image
- COVID-19 and IoT have accelerated narrowing market distribution structure, displacing traditional selling and booking arrangements

2) Local Issues as of January 11, 2021

Covid-19 containment and hospitalization capacity

- Significant progress since second wave Sept-Oct and CAR score 40 +/- (COVID Area Risk scoring)
- CAR score accounts for incidence of new cases, testing and contact tracing effectiveness, virus spread (Ideal score 2.5 correlates with low - zero COVID hospitalization, fatality)
- Primary tool assessing potential spread metrics on case doubling time, test positivity rate, new cases per 100K population
- CAR score currently 1.5 and under 2.5 since Dec 3, vaccinations in progress since early December

Community preparation

- Intensified destination cleanup, fixed hotel row flooding problem
- Working with GHRA UOG GCC to "safe certify" island hotels, restaurants, retail shops, option tours, transportation, etc.
- GVB designated credentialing authority by WTTC (UNWTO recognized). Ready to launch with membership
- Guam airport has earned WTTC "safe airport" designation, first and last destination impression
- Introducing paperless arrival and customs forms, Beta testing this month with QR codes allowing connectivity to Guam Public Health and Common Pass or WHO Apps (International health validation protocols)
- Refocused energy and resources on Guam to assist with containing the virus
 - Social Media and radio campaigns encouraging guidelines and downloads
 - COVID Alert App
 - 30,001 total downloads as of January 12, 2021
 - Download percentage to 73,200 target is 40.98%

Recovery: Requests to DPHSS

- Accepting visitors from Japan, Korea, and Taiwan with proof of negative PCR Test within five days of arrival (GIAA & GVB recommendation)
- No quarantine on Guam if fewer than five days stay
- Capable of providing testing, if required by country

Market Engagement

- Call to action campaign ready
- Need to rebuild travel network
- In constant communication with travel partners
- Sub-sector support of tour guides and optional tours ready and pending lifted restrictions

3) Source Market Issues

Japan

- o In 3rd wave
- Restrictions increasing for Tokyo and surrounding areas
- Vaccine distribution scheduled to begin in March

Travel industry anxious to restart - April Sales

Korea

- Securing enough doses for 56m people (K population at 51.64m) to begin in Feb
- o Guam was the #1 U.S. destination pre-COVID, making the island a priority for travel

Taiwan

- First to see problem coming
- o Only imported cases (no local spread)
- Travel restrictions lifted by U.S.
- Active discussions with American Institute in Taiwan (AIT) and the Taiwan government (MOFA, MOTC, CAA) create a travel bubble.

All Markets: COVID-19 Testing:

- Guam Public Health has approved 32 PCR test from the comprehensive list provided
- Japan, Korea, Taiwan
- · Opens new possibilities for Guam once quarantine measures are lifted

Recovery

- Rapid testing, vaccine distribution, all coming together to create a positive outlook
- PCOR2 announced effective Monday, January 18
- Green shoots of tourism business anticipated
- Optimistically 5 10% pre-covid by Q-4 ending September 30, 2021
- Sustain recovery momentum going into next FY 2022
- Anticipate 60% arrivals (2020 450,231) by FY 2023

Tour Guide Certification

Expanding course offerings to include Marine Tour Operators

- The course aims to reduce the impacts of tourism and recreational use on our coastal environment.
- Course curriculum modules reviewed by the University of Guam
- Certification courses will be offered for free and hosted virtually on a training platform.
- Training platform funded for up to (3) years under grant funding.

Culvert Cleaning Update

- LMS Pump Truck arriving February 5
- Will clean remaining two culverts

Membership

- The nomination deadline closed on January 9th at 5:00 pm
- Total of (7) eligible nominees
- GVB membership committee to host election virtually
- Election scheduled for February 9, 2021

Questions & Comments:

 Chairman Ada asked whether there was any indication when quarantine requirements might be reviewed or changed?

According to Vice President Perez, there are inconsistencies between the COVID Advisory Team coming out from the CDC and the local executive order related to testing.

- o Antigen testing is allowed; however, we do not allow for it
- Issue with self-quarantine for seven days; even with a negative test

Once clarity is made by the DPHSS, Management will share with the Board.

- Director Shinohara questioned the assumptions explicitly used for this year and the assumptions used to get to 60% of our historical arrivals in 2023. According to Vice President Perez, the numbers do not look good. It is complicated to forecast unless our source market provides more positive indications on their quarantine issues and additional air service.
- Director Gatewood asked with guidance from DPHSS, once vaccines are distributed, what will the process
 be for incoming travelers who have been vaccinated? What is the process for outbound travelers? What
 happens if you've taken the first shot but not the second? According to the Director of Global Marketing,
 Nadine LG, the vaccine does not prevent you from being infected by COVID. Quarantine protocols are still
 in place whether you are vaccinated or not.
- Director Gatewood would like to see social media campaigns targeting our local audience to encourage vaccination

VI. TREASURER'S REPORT

Director Shinohara made a motion, seconded by Director Gatewood, to approve all Adjusting Journal Entries
required to bring the Balance Sheet Accounts up to accurate balances, including reconstruction and update
of existing supporting schedule as of September 30, 2020, fiscal closing. Motion withdrawn by Director
Shinohara.

Background: As part of the due diligence and proper disclosure to the GVB board, management addressed significant accounting issues that were carried back from prior years audit. The action taken was reconstruction and updates of various balance sheet accounts inactive since year 10/01/2017 (last MIP book closing). This adjusting entries and account schedule prepared brings up the balance sheet account balances up to date and provides a validated baseline to ensure successful reconfiguration of the MIP Accounting system from now on and ensures accurate financial reporting presentation. The balance sheet accounts reconciliation and clean up resulted in an additional \$75,279.79 operating expenses under GL Account no.: 7000 (Inactive Balance Sheet Accounts) for FY2020 fiscal closing.

Cost Estimate: No Actual Spending except increase in Operating Expenses for FY20

Funding Source/Account: N/A

Comments & Questions:

The Board agreed that the motion presented was only for their informational purpose; an action was not needed.

- Director Shinohara stated that some adjustments were made to the journal entries on GVB's balance sheet due to prior year inconsistencies in numbers. Long outstanding issues were reconciled, and entries were adjusted for those outstanding issues. For transparency and clarity, these measures were taken to clean the books for the incoming Board of Directors in the event of an audit and to ensure that the present Board of Directors properly approved it.
- Past fiscal years adjustment journal entries are being corrected and are the adjusting entries that have been previously identified by the auditors
- The board withdrew the motion, but agreed with Management's corrective action

<u>Allotment</u>

- Waiting on December 2020 allotment
- Receiving just over half a million dollars a month
- GVB is in balance with our budget
- Bleak TAF is a concern and challenge
- Resources are being managed to care for our destination
- This year will continue to be challenging from a financial perspective

COVID Task Force Committee Minutes dated December 16, 2020

- Thanked Vice President Perez for summarizing his report in detail.
- On Guam, there are 7,444 confirmed cases, with 112 active cases and 124 deaths.
- Guam's COVID Area Risk (CAR) Score is 1.1.
- Japan: Cases continue to increase
 - As of January 14, eleven of forty-seven prefectures are in a state of emergency until February 7th.
 - Not accepting foreign arrivals into Japan
 - Japanese nationals are required to have a PCR test results upon arrival and conduct testing at the airport and must concur to strict quarantine protocols
 - Japan is following the same protocols as the CDC; must have the PCR documentation in possession
 - Japan aims to vaccinate 75% of the population; current vaccinations in inventory will not supply that full amount. Projecting it will be done by the first quarter of 2022.
- Taiwan, Korea, and Japan are becoming stricter with all arriving foreigners' border entry due to the new strain found in the UK.

COVID-19 Vaccinations

Total vaccinations administered in Guam:

- Pfizer/BioNTech
 - Total doses administered: 9.406
- Moderna
 - Total doses administered: 2,000

Administered to the following groups in phases:

- Phase 1a: Healthcare personnel and residents of long-term care facilities
- Phase 1b: Elderly adults ages 75 and up, first responders, and essential frontline workers
- Phase 1c: Adults 60-74 years of age
- Director Arriola shared Guam passed the 12,000 threshold of vaccinated residents
- Several clinics have been approved to administer vaccinations

Governor Signs Executive Order No. 2020-45

EO No. 2020-45 allows congregations of no more than fifteen (15) persons and indoor dining at eating and drinking establishments at no more than 25% of occupancy.

Governor Signs Executive Order No. 2020-46

Effective January 11, EO No. 2020-46 authorized additional activities such as amusement parks, bingo halls, game rooms, and similar businesses to resume operations at a limited capacity

 GVB hosted a virtual memorial ceremony for Mr. Yuji Mitsumori, former representative of the GVB Japan office, on December 30, 2020. More than 100 individuals paid their respects online.

Japan Market update

- The number of COVID19 infections in Japan has increased explosively since late December 2020
- Japanese Government declared a state of emergency over COVID19 for Tokyo and three neighboring prefectures (Kanagawa, Chiba, and Saitama) on January 7. Osaka, Kyoto, Hyogo, Aichi, Gifu, Tochigi, and Fukuoka will be included
- The domestic travel, Go to Travel campaign is canceled until improvement is made
- The first new COVID-19 strain was reported in Japan on December 25
- Quarantine restriction measures are in place for the time of entry
- Japanese natives returning to Japan are required to submit a negative PCR test certificate 72 hours before entering Japan
- The Japanese government will provide free COVID-19 vaccinations nationwide by late February 2020.
- Flights suspended
 - JAL suspended until March 20, 2021
 - United all Japan flights suspended until March 3rd, except Narita UA 196/197
 - UA 196/197 suspended on Tuesdays and Wednesdays in February 2020
- Japanese travel agency package tours to Guam are canceled
 - until February 28 for JTB, HIS, and KNT
 - until February for NTA
 - until March 20 for JALPAK
- JATA Tourism Expo Japan in Tokyo, scheduled for January 7-9, 2021, is canceled
- Next JMC meeting January 19, 2021

COVID update

- Incoming flights from UK are banned until January 21st to keep the new strains from the UK from entering the country
