Sixteen new cases of COVID-19 were reported today. Of the sixteen cases, seven cases were identified through contact tracing and four cases had recent travel and were identified in a quarantine facility.

To date, there have been a total of **434** confirmed cases of COVID-19 with **5** deaths, **325** released from isolation, and **104** active cases. Of those cases, **384 are classified as civilians** and **50 are military service members**.
