RE: Extension of Public Health Emergency and Industry Updates

I hope this finds each of you and your families well. This has been a challenging time for our island, and each day presents an opportunity for us to unite as an industry. We must persevere as a community to help each other. In the weeks ahead, we will be sharing pertinent industry-related information and break down the verified information from the Joint Information Center to how it will affect our industry. We welcome your feedback and will be providing contact information at the end of this letter.

THANK YOU

First, I'd like to thank our island's leaders, medical, emergency and crisis teams who have been working around the clock to battle the coronavirus outbreak. We are grateful for their sacrifices and their mission to keep us safe and informed. I also would like to recognize our industry partners that stepped up to aid our government during this time.

Business contacts have been arranged for laundry services, food service for in-room dining, and housekeeping, while meeting sanitation and decontamination protocols that follow strict U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines. The industry is working with the local government and Guam Hotel and Restaurant Association (GHRA) to provide services and ensure industry employees are protected through the use Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs), training and education, implementing standardized protocols with their pandemic plans, and constantly assessing the situation to ensure proper procedures are followed.

GHRA has been extremely valuable to us throughout this crisis. We have created a strong partnership to assist our industry through this unprecedented time. I want to thank GHRA President Mary Rhodes and her team for their passion and their efforts.

UPDATES

This past week, we received news of significant flight reductions, businesses closing, and drastic drops in hotel occupancy. Our hearts go out to our residents, many of whom work in the tourism industry, who have lost their jobs or are working reduced hours. Our industry partners continue to do their best to minimize the overall impact. We recognize the hospitality industry and their teams who have stepped up to support our government's efforts to quarantine asymptomatic travelers. It is a difficult situation for all, and GVB thanks them for





showing great care to our guests.

EXECUTIVE ORDERS IN PLACE

Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero announced yesterday during a news conference that she would be extending the public health emergency for another 14 days beyond March 30, 2020. The current Executive Order 2020-05, calling for the shutdown of non-essential businesses and mandating social isolation, still stands. The governor also included the mandate that all public beaches and parks be closed, effective immediately. The only exception to this mandate is individual use for purposes of either physical or mental exercise, subject to the social distancing requirements. The updated mandate requires residents to take social isolation more seriously contain of COVID-19. to help the spread

GVB's Visitor Safety Officers have been reminding the public of these mandates, while continuing to act as crime deterrent and concierge services for our community in Tumon.

Executive Order No. 2020-06

In the newest executive order, Gov. Leon Guerrero established the COVID-19 Unified Response Effort (CURE) Healthcare System. This will allow our government to use all the medical facilities and resources available on the island to fight COVID-19 while still providing regular medical care. The Guam Department of Labor (DOL) is working to submit an application for the Disaster Dislocated Worker grant in an effort to maximize Guam's eligibility for federal assistance to receive COVID-19 related unemployment benefits. The federally funded grant, if awarded, could potentially provide eligible participants with both disaster relief employment and

GDOE Grab-N-Go School Meals

We applaud Superintendent of Public Schools Jon Fernandez, the Guam Department of Education, Department of Agriculture and the Sodexo teams for launching their <u>"Grab-N-Go"</u> <u>school meals distribution program</u>. Beginning on Monday, 8,000 meals were served to our island's school-age children at no cost to their families. All children ages 18 years and below from public and private schools are welcomed to enjoy the meals.

The program utilizes a drive-thru operation, on a first come first served basis, and walkers are also accepted. The school meal distribution will remain operational through the remainder of the government-wide school closure due to COVID-19. The program is available on weekdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., except on holidays and during spring break (April 6-10, 2020). The program is available at the following 11 locations:

Hawaii Implements a 14-Day Quarantine For All Visitors

Hawaii Governor David Ige has asked visitors to postpone their trips to Hawaii to give the state the opportunity to address the COVID-19 health crisis. Gov. Ige has mandated a 14-day quarantine for all visitors and residents entering the state. The <u>Go Hawaii</u> site noted that the island mayors have instituted home lockdowns except for essential personnel.

Japan Implements Enhanced Screening and Quarantine Measures for Travelers from the United States

The government of Japan has implemented enhanced screening and quarantine measures to





reduce the spread of COVID-19. Effective March 26, all travelers arriving from the United States, including Japanese citizens, will be asked to self-quarantine for a period of 14 days at a designated facility, and to avoid using any public transportation until after the 14-day period. The self-quarantine location may be your residence if you live in Japan or a hotel, but the Japanese government reserves the right to "designate" the location of your self-quarantine.

GVB UPDATES

Three of our GVB team members have been supporting the Emergency Operation Center (EOC) and the Joint Information Center (JIC) by managing and distributing pertinent information to the community. They have been pulling shifts at Guam Homeland Security and Office of Civil Defense and also working remotely. The Guam Hotel and Restaurant Association (GHRA) is also sharing this commitment with us to keep our industry's voice represented and present at GHS/OCD.

Director of Global Marketing Nadine Leon Guerrero is leading our marketing team to continue to monitor our different source markets and how they are affected by COVID-19. They are conducting our Crisis Global Digital & Social Media response plan that includes daily social monitoring, implementing social media protocol and developing future recovery communication for an appropriate time.

Please note that following the new order, GVB's office will remain closed through April 13, 2020. We have advised our staff to stay safely at home and continue to follow our work from home policy.

STOP THE SPREAD – STAY AT HOME
