

The village Flores Park Pumeria or Fragipan Village Flores Humatak is located in the south-western side of the island and is part of the Hara (Southern) District. This village derives its name from the word "uma", "Uma" means to carry something on the back or a heavy load as the shoulders. Humatak is the smallest and second oldest of Guam's villages after Inalahan. This is the village that Ferdinand Magellan is alleged to have visited and it was through his escapades with the villagers that led him to rename Guam, the "Island of Thieves." (www.mugp.guam.gov)

WHAT IS A FIESTA?
The Spanish missionaries introduced the system in which individual saints were honored and recognized on their patron social celebrations at each of the villages. Fiestas have become an occasion to get together with families and friends from around the island to give thanks and celebrate. Many Chamorros are known for devotion to their patron saints. A nobena (special rosary) is held for nine days, culminating with the traditional village procession and festal masses. Devotes from around the island attend the village procession and festal masses in order to fulfill their promesa, or special devotion to a saint. (www.guampedia.com)

ST. FRANCIS, CELEBRATED SAINT
St. Francis of Assisi, patron saint of animals and environment could be viewed as the original Earth Day advocate. Francis' devotion to God was expressed through his love for all of God's creation.

THE VILLAGE OF YONA
Yona is the first southern village on the eastern side of Guam. Its boundaries stretch for six miles, for the south side of Pago Bay to the north side of the bridge at Jeff's Pirates cove in Ipan, Talofofo. The village also extends west on Route 17, or cross Island Road, from Route 4, or Chalan Kanton Tasi, to Tarzan Falls, near the Naval Magazine overlook.

TRAVEL PROTOCOLS

JAPAN

JAPANESE NATIONALS

NO QUARANTINE

- Traveler entering Japan from Guam will not be tested upon entry if they have received two times or more vaccinations and there is no need to wait at home after entering Japan.

REQUIREMENTS

- If you have been vaccinated 3 times of Covid-19 vaccine, you will be exempted from submitting a negative certificate when returning to Japan.
- If NOT, Negative result of COVID-19 test conducted within 72 hours prior to departure (RT-PCR, LAMP, TMA, TRC, Smart Amp, NEAR, Next Generation Sequence, CLEIA/ECLIA)
- Submit a written pledge that you will follow the Japanese authorities requirements and fill out questionnaires
- Install mobile application (MySOS, Google Maps, COCOA; travel insurance for COVID-19 related issues recommended

FOREIGN NATIONALS

New entry of foreign nationals

Foreign nationals who apply for new entry into Japan based on either of the following categories (1), (2) or (3) below are allowed for new entry into Japan

- (1) Foreign nationals newly entering Japan for a short-term stay (less than three months) for purposes including business and employment.
- (2) Foreign nationals newly entering Japan for a short-term stay for tourism (only when a travel agency among others organizing the trip serves as the receiving organization of the entrants)
- (3) Foreign nationals newly entering Japan for a long-term stay

ENTRY PROTOCOL EFFECTIVE FROM SEPTEMBER 7, 2022

- Pre-arrival PCR tests are dropped for travelers who have received three shots of an approved COVID-19 vaccine.
- Daily arrival cap is raised to 50,000 and entry of foreign tourists on nonguided tours allowed (for short stays for tourism purposes).

SOUTH KOREA

NO QUARANTINE

- Korea lifted the seven-day quarantine mandate for all travelers entering from abroad, regardless of whether they have been vaccinated or not, from June 8, in order to reduce economic damage and inconvenience as the virus situation has stabilized.
- Unvaccinated nationals (including unvaccinated children 6-11 years old) are no longer required to self-quarantine for seven (7) days as of June 8.

REQUIREMENTS

- South Korea lifts its current pre-travel COVID-19 test requirement for inbound travelers from September 3, 2022.
- All travelers must take a PCR test within one day of arrival in Korea.
- Foreigners must register their travel information, and a [negative PCR test result to KDCA's website Q-Code after entering Korea. https://cov19ent.kdca.go.kr/](https://cov19ent.kdca.go.kr/)
 - ❖ *Korean nationals should also register Q-Code in order to shorten the time for inspection upon entry to Korea*

TAIWAN

QUARANTINE

- All travelers are required to undergo a 3-day quarantine and a 4-day self-initiated epidemic prevention following the end of quarantine.

REQUIREMENTS

- All travelers (aside from Taiwanese passport, ARC residents, and transiting passengers for international flights) have to take a PCR who arrive at an airport in Taiwan must present a certificate of a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test taken within two days (calendar days) prior to the flight schedule time to the airline staff.
- Passengers from the U.S. (included Guam), Canada, New Zealand and Australia will be tested for COVID-19 upon arrival in Taiwan using a **saliva test** rather than a nasal swab.
- Fill out electronic health declaration form prior to departure via Quarantine System for Entry @ <https://hdhq.mohw.gov.tw>.
- Those who enter Taiwan shall confirm quarantine program (book a quarantine hotel in advance; or if traveler plan to quarantine at home or a residence of their family or friends, should make sure the principle of one person per residence is met)

Effective July 14, Taiwan is no longer requiring PCR negative test 2 days before their arrival flight for Taiwan nationals, ARC residents, and international transiting passengers.

Effective September 29, Taiwan raises weekly inbound passenger quota to 60,000; arriving passengers undergoing the “3+4” quarantine formula will be able to spend the 7-day period in a residence with others (as long as they can follow the “one person per room” principle; on-arrival saliva test will end; four rapid antigen tests kits will be handed to passengers; and visa-free entry will be restored to all reciprocating countries.

PHILIPPINES

NO QUARANTINE

- Fully vaccinated nationals / foreign nationals
- Children below 12 years who cannot be vaccinated shall follow quarantine protocols of the parent or accompanying adult/guardian

REQUIREMENTS

- All arriving passengers must register to [One Health Pass portal](#) within 48 hours prior to departure.
- Filipino and foreign nationals aged 18 and above who have received primary series of COVID-19 vaccine, and at least one (1) COVID-19 booster shot administered at any time prior to departure do NOT need a pre-departure COVID-19 test.
- If not boosted, a negative RT-PCR test taken within 48 hours or negative antigen test taken within 24 hours prior to departure from the country of origin is required.
- Self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 7th day from arrival.

FACILITY-BASED QUARANTINE

Unvaccinated, partially vaccinated, unverified nationals are subject to a facility-based quarantine until release of negative results (5th day swabbing); self-monitor until 14th day of arrival.

- Negative RT-PCR test taken within 48 hours or negative Antigen test taken within 24 hours prior to departure from the country of origin. Not applicable to children below 3 years old.
- Facility-based quarantine until the release of the negative results, testing will be on the 5th day.
- Shall self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 14th day from arrival.

OTHER MARKETS

PALAU

REQUIREMENTS (as of 01 July 2022, Directive No. 100-22)

- All travelers **must be fully vaccinated** against COVID-19, except those under 18 years of age.
- At least 14 days must have passed from second dose of vaccine; vaccines must be approved by US Food and Drug Administration or the World Health Organization (exception Medigen).
- If you are vaccinated for COVID-19, you DO NOT NEED to provide a negative COVID-19 test before entering Palau.
- All travelers are advised to practice social/physical distancing, wear a mask over the nose and mouth when within six feet of others, and avoid large indoor gatherings for fourteen (14) days prior to travel to the Republic.
 - Unvaccinated individuals under 18 years of age must adhere to above requirements.

ISOLATION & QUARANTINE

- Any person proven or strongly suspected to be infected with COVID-19 shall be isolate for a period deemed necessary by MHHS at a government designated facility or at home at the discretion of the Director of Public Health.
 - The isolation rooms of Belau National Hospital shall be reserved for infected persons in need of critical care.
- Any person determined to have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19 shall self-monitor for a period of 10 days and follow guidelines as deemed necessary by the Ministry of Health.

THAILAND

REQUIREMENTS (as of 01 July 2022)

- All travelers aged 18 and older must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 with an approved vaccine at least 14 days before travel to Thailand OR present a negative RT-PCR or professional ATK (antigen) COVID-19 test result issued within 72 hours before departure.
 - If unvaccinated traveler does not present negative test, traveler will be required to pay for and take a COVID-19 test on-site.
 - Travelers aged 5-17 unaccompanied must get vaccinated with at least one dose of an approved vaccine at least 14 days before traveling to Thailand OR present a negative COVID-19 test result issued no more than 72 hours before departure. (*exempted if traveling with parents that meet requirement). Under 6 years are exempt from test.
- Medical insurance and “Thailand Pass” not required.
- Masks are not required.
- All travelers must undergo entry screening including body temperature check and presentation of documents.

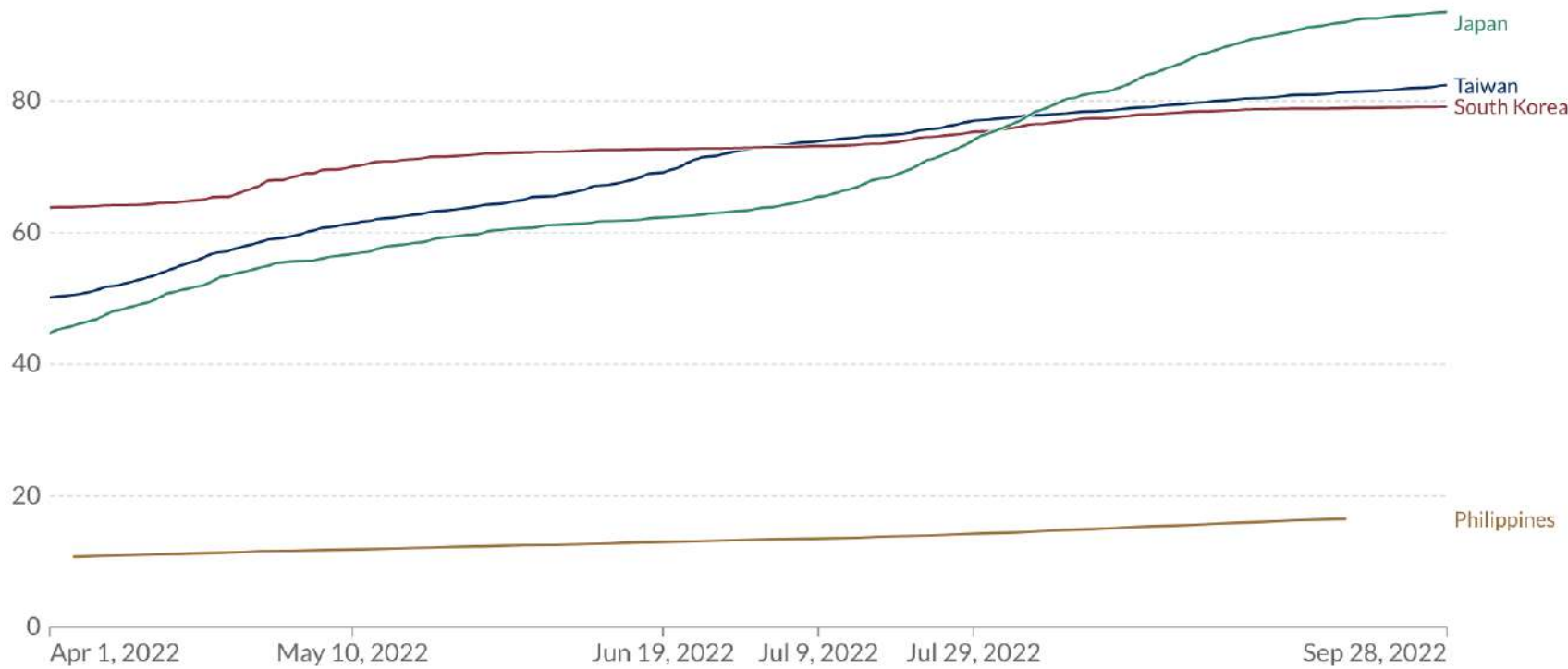

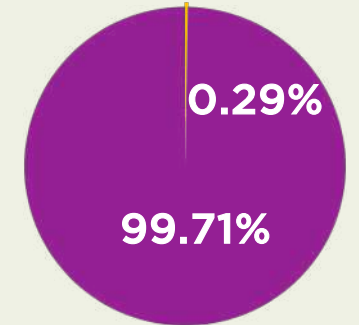

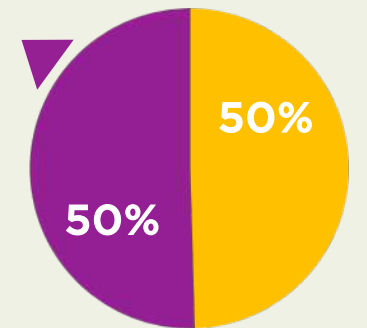

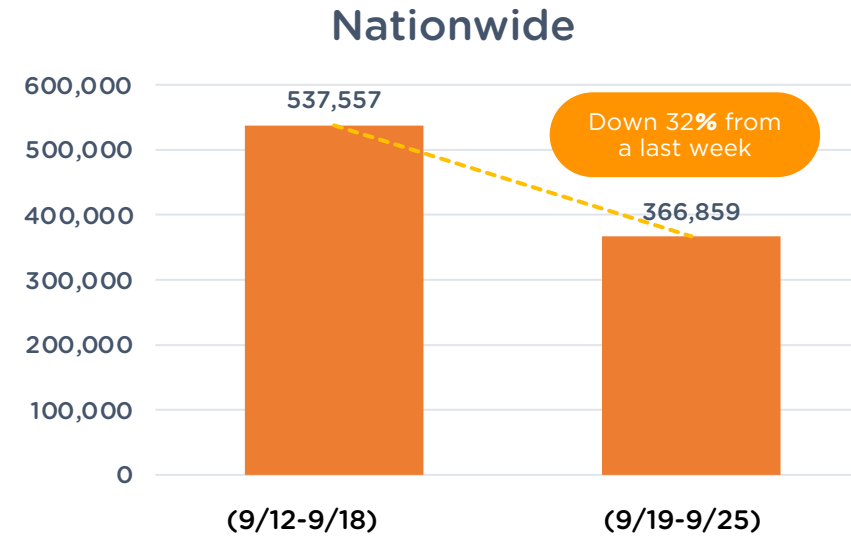
HIGHLIGHTS

- Comparing the number of new cases of new coronaviruses with the average number of new cases averaged over the week up to the 15th, all prefectures continue to show a downward trend, but the speed of decline is slowing down in many areas.

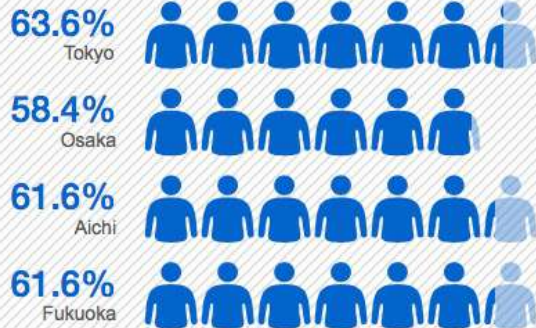

ENTRY PROTOCOLS

HIGHLIGHTS

- As of September 7, the 72-hour corona test required upon entry and return to the country will be waived, provided that the person has already been vaccinated three times.
- The government has raised the daily entry limit to 50,000 people since September 7. The new limit allows entry from all countries through unaccompanied package tours to Japan.
- PCR testing (negative proof) within 72 hours prior to local departure remains mandatory for those who have received two or less vaccinations.

ENTRY PROTOCOLS

REMOVAL OF THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ENTRY LIMIT FROM OCTOBER 11

On October 22 (Japan Standard Time), Prime Minister Kishida announced a policy to remove the cap on the number of people who can enter Japan, to allow free individual travel, and to waive visa requirements for short-term stays, effective October 11, regarding waterfront measures for the new Corona virus. Also on October 11, the government announced its policy to launch a nationwide travel support program and a consumption stimulus program targeting event businesses, etc.

TAIWAN TO OPEN BORDERS TO CHINA, HONG KONG, AND MACAU CITIZENS SEPT. 29

As the country begins to open its borders in stages, Taiwan will allow four categories of citizens from China, Hong Kong, and Macau to enter the country on Sept. 29.



On Thursday, Premier Su Tseng-chang announced the Cabinet approved the first stage of easing border restrictions for Taiwan, with the changes to take effect on Sept. 29. The second stage is likely to take effect on Oct. 13.

Also on Thursday, the Mainland Affairs Council (MAC) announced that taking into consideration humanitarian needs, family reunions, and the operation and management of Chinese-funded enterprises in Taiwan, the entry requirements for Chinese, Hong Kong, and Macau nationals will be relaxed on Sept. 29.

TAIWAN COULD END MANDATORY QUARANTINE FOR ARRIVALS OCT. 13

Taiwan's mandatory quarantine for arriving visitors could be lifted on Oct. 13 at the earliest, Premier Su Tseng-chang announced Thursday.

The actual start date is contingent on how the local COVID-19 situation develops, Cabinet Spokesperson Lo Ping-cheng quoted Su as saying after a weekly Cabinet meeting.

Su also approved first-stage measures to ease border controls that were scheduled to take effect on Sept. 29, including raising the weekly cap on arriving visitors from the current 50,000 to 60,000, and canceling mandatory deep-throat saliva PCR tests upon arrival, Lo said.

Instead, each arriving visitor will be given four rapid antigen test kits, but will not be required to perform a test on-site, he said.

If "everything goes as planned," second-stage measures will be implemented on Oct. 13 after a two-week public review period, he said.

TAIWAN ANNOUNCES NEW '3+4,' '0+7' RULES FOR ARRIVALS FROM ABROAD

On Thursday (Sept. 22), the CECC announced that eased regulations for the "3+4" quarantine scheme will go into effect on Sept. 29, while quarantine will be discontinued in favor of the "0+7" self-health monitoring plan from Oct. 13.

During a press conference on Thursday afternoon, CECC head Victor Wang confirmed earlier statements by Premier Su Tseng-chang that the border will be opened in two stages. The first phase, which starts on Sept. 29 will expand visa-free entry, raise the passenger quota, introduce the "one person per room" rule, and end saliva tests upon arrival.



The second phase, which is tentatively scheduled for Oct. 13, will see the weekly arriving passenger quota raised to 150,000, the "0 +7" plan introduced, the opening of borders to travelers from countries not granted visa-free treatment, and the end of the tour group ban. CECC spokesperson Chuang Jen-Hsiang then elaborated on the details of the "3+4" and "0+7" COVID prevention plans for new arrivals.

TAIWAN RECEIVES SECOND BATCH OF NOVAVAX VACCINE

Taiwan took delivery on Thursday morning of a second shipment of the Novavax COVID-19 vaccine containing 504,000 doses, which are scheduled to be distributed to local governments starting Sept. 30.



The vaccine doses arrived at the Taoyuan International Airport at 7:09 a.m. from Amsterdam Airport Schiphol on China Airlines flight CI-74.

People aged 12 or older are eligible for the vaccine.

The shipment was part of the nation's agreement with the Gavi Vaccine Alliance to purchase 4.76 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines, including about 2.27 million doses of the Novavax vaccine, under the COVAX international vaccine distribution system.

The CECC will decide on the implementation date of the respective policy based on developments in the pandemic situation. The following measures are expected to take effect on October 13 (O+7):

I. Weekly cap on arriving travelers: in principle, the weekly cap will be 150,000 on a trial basis.

II. Quarantine period and location: the day of arrival counts as Day 0; a 7 self-initiated epidemic prevention will be adopted to replace the original 3 days of quarantine. Also, the COVID-19 Health Declaration and Home Quarantine Notice will no longer be issued to arriving travelers.

III. Testing measures are listed below.

A. Four rapid test kits will be given to arrivals aged 2 and older by workers at international airports/ports upon arrival.

IV. Travelers from countries not granted Taiwan's visa exemption treatment will be allowed to apply for visas to enter Taiwan for regular social visits and tourism. The ban on tour groups will be also be lifted.

Effective September 12, Taiwan to reinstate visa-exempt entry for nationals of US, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, countries in Europe, and diplomatic allies

On September 5, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) announced that, to be in line with international trends and to balance the needs of disease prevention efforts and promotion of economic and social activities, Taiwan will restore visa exemption treatment for the nationals of the US, Canada, New Zealand, Australia, countries in Europe, and Taiwan's diplomatic allies starting September 12, 2022. The CECC reminds the public that the above border measures and relevant epidemic prevention measures will be adjusted on a rolling basis based on developments in the pandemic situation.

Effective from August 15, Taiwan to remove requirement that inbound passengers should provide COVID-19 PCR test result within two days of flight schedule time.

However, those who test positive abroad are still required to wait over seven days from their specimen collection date before taking a flight to Taiwan in order to prevent cross-border transmission of the disease.

On August 15, the Central Epidemic Command Center (CECC) announced that, effective from September 1, mandatory quarantine for arrivals will remain to be three days of quarantine and four days of self-initiated epidemic prevention. Furthermore, the one person per room rule will be adopted for the four-day period of self-initiated epidemic prevention. Related rules are listed below.



I. Quarantine period and location:

- A. Three days of quarantine: quarantining at home or a residence of a friend or family member, with the one person per room rule being followed, or staying at a quarantine hotel.
- B. Four days of self-initiated epidemic prevention:
 1. An arrival may undergo self-initiated epidemic prevention at his or her home or a residence of his friend or family that meets the one person per room rule. This rule means a room used to undergo self-initiated epidemic prevention. An arrival may not stay at a general hotel.
 2. After completing the three-day quarantine, an arrival can go to a place that meets the one person per room rule to undergo self-initiated epidemic prevention.

Testing measures:

- A. PCR testing: deep-throat saliva samples will be collected from arrivals for PCR testing at the airport/port of entry on the day of arrival (Day 0).
- B. At-home rapid tests: two rapid test kits will be given to arrivals aged 2 and older by workers at international airports/ports upon arrival; arrivals can use the test kits when symptoms occur during quarantine and before they go out for the first time during the self-initiated epidemic prevention period.

KARDING LEAVES 6 DEAD; 3 PROVINCES WORST HIT

Five rescuers were the first confirmed casualties of Super Typhoon Karding (international name: Noru), the strongest storm to hit the country this year that left a trail of destruction, stripping off roofs, knocking out power lines, and toppling structures as it barreled through the mainly agricultural provinces of Central Luzon region on Sunday until early Monday.

The rescuers were from the Bulacan Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO), who drowned while conducting rescue operations in San Miguel town, where 40 of the 49 villages were submerged in floodwaters due to strong rains spawned by the typhoon, Mayor Roderick Tiongson said on Monday.



NEW COVID CASES IN NCR EXCEED AUGUST PEAK

The National Capital Region (NCR) or Metro Manila logged 1,600 new Covid-19 cases on September 25, surpassing the peak of 1,502 cases recorded on August 7, OCTA Research reported on Monday. The Covid positivity rate in the region has also gone up, from 15.7 percent on September 15, to 18.5 percent on September 24, exceeding August 5 rate of 17.5 percent, OCTA Research fellow Dr. Guido David said.

"The one-week growth rate in NCR increased to 25 percent as of September 25, almost double the one-week growth rate of 13 percent on September 18," David said. David did not find the rising indicators as alarming, since healthcare utilization remained low at a low 36 percent.

CEBU PACIFIC RESUMES INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS FROM DAVAO

Cebu Pacific has announced the resumption of its international operations in its Davao hub, starting with flights to Singapore.



The airline is the first local carrier to resume international flights from Davao since the COVID pandemic struck in 2020.

Cebu Pacific will have flights from Davao to Singapore every Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday.

“We are very excited to bring back this route as we know passengers in Mindanao have been waiting for more affordable and convenient flight options. Now that we’ve strengthened our operations from Manila, it’s time we move forward to grow our regional hubs as we work toward restoring 100 percent of our pre-pandemic capacity,” Xander Lao, Cebu Pacific chief commercial officer, said.

STATUS OF VISA PROCESSING AT THE U.S. EMBASSY IN THE PHILIPPINES
The U.S. Embassy in the Philippines is providing all routine visa services, though interview appointments for some visa classes remain limited in order to prioritize travelers with urgent needs and certain critical categories of visas. Due to a high volume of applicants and consular staffing shortages, wait-times for many visa classes are longer than the pre-pandemic norm.

For those visa applicants that paid a visa application fee and are still waiting to schedule an interview appointment, the validity of your payment (known as the MRV fee) is **extended until September 30, 2023**.

TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS OVERVIEW

Advisory

- For public safety and in compliance with Philippine Laws (IATF resolution 88, 150 and RA No. 11332), all individuals travelling to USA from Philippines and vice versa will still be required to wear a mask throughout the flight and when inside the Philippine terminal.
- Please note that for US flights, the new Transportation Security Agency (TSA) lifting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) mask mandate still recognizes other jurisdictions' mask requirements. The CDC likewise recommends the wearing of face masks in indoor public transportation such as during flights.
- Violation of the Philippine government's mandate shall be punishable by a fine of not less than Ph20,000.00 but not more than Php50,000.00, and/or imprisonment of not less than one (1) month and not more than six (6) months. Foreign nationals found to be in violation shall be subject to deportation proceedings after service of sentence

Allowed Travelers

- Fully vaccinated and Unvaccinated US Citizens, US Nationals, Lawful Permanent Residents, and Immigrants
- Fully Vaccinated non-US Citizen and non-US Immigrant
- Exempted Unvaccinated Non-US Citizen and non-US Immigrant

**Unvaccinated Non-US Citizen and non-US Immigrant are not allowed entry into the United States unless exempted.*
